

Informative Speech with a Visual Aid

Time Limit: 4-6 minutes

Outline Due: end of class on 4-11-11

Speeches Presented: 4-13-11

Purpose: This speech is given to give your audience a clearer understanding of a topic. You should arouse your audience's interest and provide them with information that they don't already know. Your sources of information may be your own personal experiences, magazines, newspapers, reference books, or personal sources.

The purpose of this speech is the same as the informative speech. You will be asked to pick a topic that you have an interest in but would like to know more about for your topic. You will be required to do library research and quote from specific sources in this speech, so your information is going to be much more specific and detailed.

Bibliography Cards

On **4-11-11 AT THE START OF CLASS** you will be asked to turn in at least 3 sources of the information you found for your speech. They should be 3 different sources if possible (not 3 magazines or any wiki entries) and as current as possible.

Quotes

You must quote from the above sources at least twice during your speech you can quote statistics, survey results, important information etc. to add weight to and authority to your speech. When you quote you will need to refer to your source.

"In the December 1, 1992 issue of Newsweek magazine it is stated that the first 100 days of the Clinton Presidency will be the most important."

Visual Aid

Your visual aid can take many forms other than a poster (see handout). you can also use the overhead projector, another person (a model), a video tape, or pictures. Just make sure the visual aid adds to your speech.

As always I am going to ask you to practice your presentation skills during this speech. Good eye contact, and good clear voice should be present with everyone. Work on hand gestures or perhaps moving away from the podium this time
